Articles to be considered for publication may be on any subject within the field but should not exceed 7,500 words and should be written in English. The Editorial Assistant is willing to undertake translations of texts from Portuguese if required; there will be a charge for this service.

Contributions should be submitted in a form ready for publication and sent as an email attachment to the Editorial Assistant at richard.correll@kcl.ac.uk. The text should conform precisely to the conventions of the *MHRA Style Guide*, 2nd edn, 2008 (978-0-947623-76-0), obtainable from www.style.mhra.org.uk, price £6, US \$15, €10; an online version of the *Guide* is also available from the same address. Quotations and references should be carefully checked. *Portuguese Studies* regrets that it must charge contributors with the cost of corrections in proof which the Editors in their discretion think excessive.
