

MHRA Journals Contributor's Publishing Agreement

Conditions for Publication Policy

In order to publish your Contribution we need your agreement in writing. Please read the terms of this Agreement carefully and sign and return the form to us as quickly as possible.

1. It is our practice, together with most other serials and journals publishers, to ask you to assign to the MHRA the copyright of Contributions accepted for publication in our journals. The reasons for this are as follows:

(i) ownership of copyright by the publisher tends to ensure maximum international protection against infringement, libel or plagiarism

(ii) it enables the MHRA to deal efficiently with requests from third parties to reproduce or reprint a Contribution, or part of it, and in accordance with a general policy which is sensitive both to any relevant changes in international copyright law and to the general desirability of encouraging the dissemination of knowledge.

2. Two 'moral rights' were conferred on Authors by the UK Copyright Act in 1988. In the UK an Author's 'right of paternity', the right to be properly credited whenever the work is published (or performed or broadcast), requires that this right is asserted in writing.

3. In assigning your copyright you are not forfeiting your proprietary rights, including patent rights. Nothing in this Agreement shall restrict your rights as the Author(s) to revise, adapt, prepare derivative works, present orally or otherwise make use of the contents of the Contribution, provided that these do not conflict with the MHRA's financial interests. You may do this after obtaining our permission (but see also 8(i) below). The MHRA is a charity which has the encouragement and dissemination of scholarship as its object, and permission to use the contents of your work elsewhere will not normally be withheld provided that the MHRA journal is acknowledged as the original source with a full bibliographical reference.

4. You will be informed, as far as is practicable, of all requests to reproduce your Contribution, or a substantial part of it, or figures, tables or illustrations from it in another print publication where your Contribution is specifically requested, rather than as part of the journal as a whole. Granting of permission will be subject to your approval, which we will assume is given if we have not heard from you within four weeks of your approval being sought. It is our policy to share equally with the Author(s) any fees received from commercial publishers for permission to reproduce work in print when the total fee is greater than US\$100.

5. When the Contribution is accepted we undertake to publish it as soon as we reasonably can and we will endeavour to maximize the visibility of the journal and of your Contribution within it. If the Contribution is not published in the MHRA's journal, the rights revert to the present copyright holder.

6. The MHRA participates in a number of photocopying and digitization licensing schemes which exist in many countries, for example, the Copyright Licensing Agency (UK) and Copyright Clearance Center (USA), non-profitmaking organizations which offer centralized licensing arrangements. Any income received through these arrangements will be used to advance the interests of the MHRA by assisting the further publication of works of scholarship which would not normally be commercially viable.

7. In addition to publication of your Contribution in conventional printed form, your assignment of copyright also signifies your agreement to its publication and/or storage electronically. The MHRA may also arrange to include your Contribution in electronic document-delivery services and databases without further consultation.

8. By signing this form you certify that:

(i) your Contribution is your original work, has not been published before, and is not being considered for publication elsewhere, and that no version of the Contribution in the same or a similar form has been published in electronic form on any website or in any digital repository whether personal or institutional. If the Contribution is accepted for publication you may re-publish it on your personal website or in your academic institution's digital repository without seeking further permission from the Association, but no earlier than 24 months after publication by the MHRA and only if a full bibliographical reference to the original source is included: see 3 above. (The Association will provide a PDF version of the final typeset file upon request for this purpose.)

(ii) you have obtained permission for and acknowledged the source of excerpts from other copyright works; the relevant permission correspondence should be attached to this form. If you are in doubt about whether or not permission is required, please contact the MHRA: failure to obtain such permission would be an infringement of copyright and could, in some circumstances, lead to litigation

(iii) to the best of your knowledge the Contribution contains no statements that are libellous, unlawful or in any way actionable

(iv) you indemnify the MHRA in respect of claims made against it by third parties for copyright infringement relating to publication of the Contribution, or concerning the Authorship of the Contribution or rights to publish the Contribution.

For jointly Authored Contributions all Authors must sign a copy of this form.

If the Contribution is accepted for publication in the Journal, then I

(i) assign the present and future copyright in this Contribution and in any abstract prepared by me to accompany the Contribution, throughout the world in any form (including print, electronic and digital form) and in any language, exclusively to the MHRA

(ii) agree that the MHRA may seek payment of fees from corporate bodies or individuals for the privilege of making copies of the Contribution from the conventional printed form or from Contributions stored electronically, e.g. by document-delivery services

(iii) agree to indemnify the MHRA in respect of claims made against it by third parties for copyright infringement related to publication of the Contribution, or concerning the Authorship of the Contribution or rights to publish the Contribution

(iv) warrant that the Contribution does not, to the best of my knowledge, contain anything which is libellous, defamatory or obscene, and that it has not been published elsewhere, and that it does not infringe any rights of others

(v) agree that the MHRA reserves the right to make such editorial changes it deems necessary, but that any substantial alteration will not be made without consultation with the Author(s).

(vi) agree that the attached Conditions for Publication form part of this Agreement
